Year 6 Evacuation Theme Day

Year 6 have travelled back in time to 1st September 1939, when millions of children were evacuated from the cities to the countryside. Year 6 children came into school dressed as evacuees, with gas masks and name labels, complete with popular 1930s names. We travelled by imaginary train to Amberley in Sussex, playing Beetle and singing well-known WW2 songs. Once the children had "arrived" in the countryside, they took part in a WW2 cookery lesson, learning how to make coconut ice from scratch. Following this, it was vital that the children learned how to make Anderson shelters to keep them safe in an air raid, so in groups of 3 or 4, children created models which were judged by our stern headteacher! There was an air raid at lunchtime and lots of 1940s dancing. The day ended with the children writing a letter home describing their first day in the countryside, including their surprise at seeing a real cow for the first time!
